Overview of the U.S. Labor History (every 5 years)

1777 Vermont becomes the first state to abolish slavery.

1793 Congress passes the first Fugitive Slave Act, making it a crime to harbor an escaped slave.

1795 The first American factory, a spinning mill, is established in Pawtucket, RI.

1825 Using indentured Irish immigrants and Native American labor. The Erie Canal is completed, opening the way for the eventual industrialization of the Northeast.

1827 New York State abolishes slavery and the first black-owned and operated newspaper in the United States, Freedom's Journal, is established by a group of free blacks in New York City.
